Further, no interest or penalties have been accrued or charged to expense as of September 30, 2021 and 2020 or for the years then ended. The Medical Center's tax returns are subject to possible examination by the taxing authorities. For federal income tax purposes, the tax returns essentially remain open for possible examination for a period of three years after the respective filing deadlines of those returns.

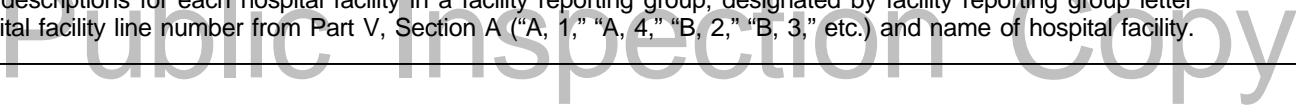
